2017 Tractor Safety Program

Racine and Kenosha County UW-Extension will be holding a youth tractor safety program during the week of **June 19-23** at Burlington High School. This 24-hour program meets the requirements of Wisconsin Act 455, which requires youth under the age of 16 to hold a certificate of training in order to operate a tractor or self-propelled implement of

The course provides both classroom and hands-on tractor driving experiences designed for youth under the age of 16 and over the age of 12. Junior Leaders' Scholarship

This scholarship is sponsored by the Walworth County 4-H Junior Leaders' Association. The recipients of this award will be the applicants who demonstrate the greatest passion for leading by example through their efforts in the Junior Leaders' Association. Two awards of \$500 each will be given annually. You may drop it off in person, mail it, fax it, or scan and email it, but all applications must be received by 5:00pm on **June 15** in order to be considered.

Horse and Pony Scholarship

Minimum Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicant must have a high school graduation date of June of current year or earlier.
- Applicant must have been a Walworth County 4-H Horse & Pony Project member for at least two (2) years.
- Applicant must be enrolled or planning to enroll as an undergraduate in a university, college, or technical school during the upcoming academic year.
- Applicant must have a current grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.

Selection criteria is located on the application. Applications are due in the Walworth County UW-Extension Office on or before **June 30** or they will not be considered. Recipients will be announced during the Opening Ceremony of the 4-H Qualifying Show.

Sheila DeGrave Memorial Scholarship

To be eligible for this scholarship:

- You must have been actively involved in the Walworth County Horse & Pony project, either through 4-H or FFA.
- You must be a high school senior with plans to continue your education at a 4-year college (long or short course) or a 2-year technical school. Please include

- proof of enrollment/acceptance to the school.
- Please have the application at the UW-Extension office by 5:00pm on June 30.

Recipients will be announced during the Opening Ceremony of the 4-H Qualifying Show.

Earl Cook Memorial Scholarship

This \$500 scholarship is given to students who are a high school senior or enrolled in a post–high school education program <u>and</u> plan to continue their education in any agricultural field at the college/technical level.

Applications are due in the UW-Extension office by **June 30**.

Hafs 4-H Leadership Award

The Hafs 4-H Leadership Award is a University of Wisconsin scholarship to memorialize Oscar W. Hafs' 65 years leading the Bloomfield Township 4-H Club in Walworth County, WI. One \$2,000 award will be given annually.

The winner/s will be chosen based on two things: the content and completeness of the application and the quality of a supporting scholarship interview. Applications must be accompanied by one letter of recommendation from an adult who can attest to your 4-H leadership growth through involvement in the 4-H program. Application and letter of recommendation are due at 5:00pm on June 30.

Walworth County Business Association and Outstanding Youth Award

Robert O. Jones 4-H Scholarship

This Scholarship is given by the family of Bobby Jones long time 4-H member and leader. Bobby was always helping 4-H kids, and he had a great passion for helping those willing to learn. In his memory, the family would like to provide assistance to students pursuing coursework beyond high school.

The recipient(s) of this award will be the applicant(s) who demonstrates the greatest passion for leading by example through their efforts in 4-H and in their community. The family has decided to award up to \$1000 annually to one or more deserving individuals, depending on the number of applications received.

- Applicant must be a CURRENT Walworth County 4-H member

- Applications must be accompanied by two letters of recommendation
- Applications must be received by the Extension office NO later than June 15

Walworth County Fair Judging

Art

If you are entering hangable artwork for this year's fair, please make sure that it is READY TO HANG with adequately sturdy hangers when you bring it to judging. Art judging will be happening on Wednesday, **August 16** from 11:00—6:00pm in the Youth Building at the fairgrounds. Refer to the "2016-2017 Walworth County Fair Book."

Cloverbud

Cloverbud project judging will take place on a first come, first served basis on Thursday, **August 17** from NOON-6:00pm in the Youth Building at the Fairgrounds. Cloverbud judging will be done face-to-face, as it is with older members. However, unlike judging in other areas, Cloverbud exhibitors will NOT be competing with each other. Everyone will receive the same fabulous participation ribbon! So, judging is more like a show-and-tell opportunity to prepare for the judging procedures that happen down the road. Cloverbud exhibits are not eligible for premium money.

Youth Building

If you are enrolled in a 4-H project that gets displayed and judged in the Youth Building, you've got a neat experience ahead! Most project exhibits are judged using a method called "face-to-face judging." This unique type of judging gives you the chance to talk privately with the judge so he/she can find out what you've learned! The judge considers what you've told him/her when assigning the rating ribbons and choosing class winners!

Here are some things to remember as you prepare:

- Your exhibit offers a display of what you are capable of doing in your project area.
- The judges will be looking for positive learning. Tell them about your exhibit and any other things you have done and learned in your project this year.
- The judge will be evaluating your exhibit and what you've learned—not you as a person.
- Read the rules and guidelines in your Fair Book. Be certain that you've followed the established rules for

the class you've entered.

Questions the judge may ask you...

- Did you enjoy working on your project? Why?
- What was the easiest/hardest thing you did?
- · Why did you choose to make this exhibit?
- Who assisted you with your project?
- Tell me about the kinds of materials you used.
- How did you make the exhibit?
- What part of the exhibit do you feel you could improve? Why?

If you prepare a neat and creative exhibit, you're ready to tell the judges a lot, and you've followed the rules in the Fair Book, you have nothing to worry about. Face-to-face judging will be a fun learning experience for you! Refer to the enclosed schedule for judging day and time for the projects you're making exhibits for.

Foods

Foods judging is completed using a different form of judging called "conference judging." Conference judging is similar to face-to-face judging. The main difference is that it is not done privately. Rather, all of the 4-Hers who have entered a particular fair class will be present for judging TOGETHER. They all meet with the judge at the same time so they can learn from each other. 4-Hers must be present when their classes are called.

Youth who are completing grades 3-6 will be judged throughout the morning on Tuesday, **August 15** in North Hall at the Walworth County Fairgrounds. Class #1 for each grade level will be judged at 9:00am, and judging of classes will continue in consecutive order until all classes for the grade level are done.

Youth who are completing grades 7-13 will be judged

throughout the afternoon on Tuesday, **August 15** in North Hall at the Walworth County Fairgrounds. Class #1 for each age division will be judged at 1:30pm, and judging of classes will continue in consecutive order until all classes for the grade level are done. All Delicious Dairy Dish entries will be judged at 1:00pm on **August 15**.

Food Preservation entries will be judged at their own location within North Hall throughout the day. All exhibitors in grades 3-6 will be judged starting at 9:00am. Classes will be called in numerical order. Exhibitors in grades 7-13 will be judged in the afternoon in the same manner beginning at 1:00pm.

For judging purposes, your "grade level" is the grade you just completed.

Fair Entry Deadline—Fast Approaching!

4-H families are reminded that the Junior Department entry deadline for the 2017 Walworth County Fair is 11:59pm on Friday, June 16. The system will shut down at midnight, so don't wait until the last minute to place your entries.

If you see any problems, notify the <u>Fair Office</u> immediately. **Absolutely no corrections can be made to any entries after 5:00pm on July 14.**

Sheep News

SHEEP Project members are required to attend ONE mandatory meeting each year in order to be eligible to show in the Junior Sheep Show at the Walworth County Fair. The final mandatory meeting option left for 2017 is a "Show Ready" Project Workshop on **June 15** at 7:00pm at the Walworth County Fairgrounds Sheep Barn. This will be an interactive meeting, so come prepared to handle sheep in the show ring and put your evaluation skills to the test.

Keep in mind that if you attended MAQA training this spring, your participation counts as an educational meeting. You can also get credit for MAQA if you tested this spring and passed, and you can get credit for having attended the 2016 Walworth County Fair Lamb Carcass Evaluation during last year's fair week. If you attend the 2017 Walworth County Fair Lamb Carcass Evaluation meeting during fair week this year, it will count towards your 2018 mandatory meeting requirements.

Show Prep Reminders

Remember that breeding sheep and other sexually intact sheep must have a scrapies tag in order to exhibit at the Walworth County Fair. In-state wethers intended for slaughter, which are less than 12 months old, do NOT need

scrapies tags. Out of state wethers must have scrapies tags. Scrapies tagging is a family farm responsibility.

If you are showing breeding sheep, it is important to work on getting your purebred registration papers now, too. That can also take a while.

Managerial Projects

Members planning to show managerial animals at the 2017 Walworth County Fair must complete a Wisconsin State Fair Junior Livestock Managerial Form and submit it to the Extension office by 4:30 pm on **June 16**. The form is available at http://walworth.uwex.edu/4-youth-development/projects/sheep-project/.

Lose an RFID Tag?

If any of your market lambs lose their RFID tag between now and the start of fair, it is your responsibility to contact Jr. Sheep Superintendent Tim Ehlen at 608-676-2569 to have the animal retagged. Please look for and be ready to turn in the old tag that is being replaced. State Fair Update

Junior exhibitors planning to show at the Wisconsin State Fair will need to submit all entry information and fees directly to State Fair either online or via the mail. The local county UW-Extension office will be informed of State Fair youth entries, but will not be involved in the entry process. Junior exhibitors must be members in good standing with an approved youth organization (such as 4-H) by March 1 in order to be eligible to participate in Junior Fair programs. The Junior Show entry deadlines are:

- June 7, 2017: Postmark for mailed entries
- June 7, 2017 7:00pm (Central Time): Online entries close at regular fees
- June 14, 2017 7:00pm (Central Time): Late online entries with late fees close
