Walworth County 4-H Camp is set for June 11-15 at Upham Woods near Wisconsin Dells, WI. (Camp is a day longer than in previous years.)

Walworth County UW-Extension is now accepting applications for 2019 4-H Camp Counselor positions. We are looking for responsible, energetic, enthusiastic teens to serve as outstanding role models for this year's campers. Whether you've served as a counselor in the past, or are giving this idea brand new consideration, you are welcome and encouraged to submit your application! Three counselor roles are available: *Junior Director, Cabin Counselor, and Resource Counselor*.

The positions of *Cabin Counselor* and *Resource Counselor* are open to youth in grades 9-13, who will be at least 15 years old by camp. *Cabin Counselors* work primarily with a small group of campers for the duration of camp week. *Resource Counselors* are largely responsible for planning and conducting the fun workshops and activities campers participate in on a daily basis. All counselors will enjoy sleeping in the camp cabins and have shared responsibility for campers overnight.

The role of *Junior Director* is open to candidates who served as counselors in 2018, are presently in grades 11-13, and who are able to attend all of the scheduled counselor trainings (below) and regularly meet with the UW-Extension staff (between February and June) to coordinate the trainings and camp week itself.

<u>Completed counselor applications must be in the UW-Extension office by 4:30 p.m.</u> on Monday, January 28<sup>th</sup> (or turned in during the Junior/Senior Leaders' Association meetings that night). Postmark deadline is January 25. Applications must be supported by one reference letter. This reference letter will be accepted until 9:00 a.m. on February 6. Simply ask your reference to follow the submission information on the form itself. A completed reference form must be on file for you in order for you to interview. So, please ask someone to complete your reference form <u>right</u> <u>away</u> and then follow-up to make sure that they had a chance to do it a few days before the February 6 deadline.

Counselor <u>interviews will occur on Wednesday evening</u>, <u>February 6</u> at the UW-Extension office. A time will be assigned to you. You will be contacted with that time by Friday, February 1.

Camp counselor trainings are on the dates that follow. <u>It is important that you attend all trainings</u>. Your service as a camp counselor is a very IMPORTANT job. Please respect the fact that campers' parents would appreciate you being as prepared for the camp experience as you possibly can. Training dates are:
