Her family, with the help of the Horse and Pony Committee, continues to present these two scholarships (\$500/\$250) to give financial support to two students who have been involved in the Horse and Pony Project. This scholarship recognizes students for their true sportsmanship while in the project.

Sheila was a member of the Walworth County Horse & Pony Project for over 9 years, starting out in Horseless Horse, moving up through the riding program, and finally finding her calling as a driving girl. Along the way, she never stopped giving of herself to others to help better the experience of her fellow members. Sheila was known to stay late at the farm to help feed animals, load carts, unload equipment, help the younger kids if their horses were being spunky, volunteer to be a rider so younger members felt safer, or even clean stalls. Sheila volunteered to help wherever it was needed, even though sometimes this meant she didn't get to work her own pony. She would always say, "He's fine. I'll work with him tomorrow." This scholarship is dedicated to students who have these same giving qualities.

To be eligible for this scholarship:

- 1. You must have been actively involved in the Walworth County Horse & Pony project, either through 4-H or FFA.
- 2. You must be a high school senior with plans to continue your education at a 4-year college (long or short course) or a 2-year technical school. Please include proof of enrollment/acceptance to the school.
- 3. Please have the application at the Walworth County Extension office **by 5:00pm on June 24.**
- 4. Recipients will be announced during the Opening Ceremony of the 4-H Qualifying Show.
