4-H Project Leader Training

4-H Project Leader Training will be held on November 21, 6-8 p.m. at the County Government Center. All current 4-H project committee members, club and county project leaders (youth or adult), and adults/teens interested in facilitating project work with members during the next year are asked to attend to get everyone on the same page. The evening will include PIZZA/SALAD dinner, project member survey results, Walworth County Project experience goals, and guidelines for quality project meetings, resource ideas, planning time, and more! There will also be door prizes!

Please pre-register through your family's 4HOnline account no later than Friday, November 15th at noon.

Registration for this event will open in 4HOnline on October 11. To sign-up, you must first enroll or re-enroll for the 2019-2020 year and submit. Then log back in to your account and register for *Project Leader Training*. You do NOT have to be approved or fully screened to participate.

Youth Leadership Opportunities

Back-to-4-H Night

A huge thank you goes to all of the club and project volunteers, both youth and adult, who hosted booths during this year's Back-to-4-H Night event on October 1. Thirteen project groups participated, along with a booth on 4-H Camp, Out-of-State Exchange, Cloverbuds, and General Info/Registration. Eighty-four prospective new members completed participation passports. A total of 5,844 promotional fliers, including 3,689 English, 191 Spanish, and 1,964 English/Spanish were distributed through 35 public and private schools county-wide. Additionally, four additional schools/groups agreed to share the promotional fliers digitally on their websites, through newsletters, or via social media; one school distributed fliers in their office and shared digitally. Fliers were also distributed at the Walworth County Fair and through a boosted post on the 4-H Facebook Page (11,882 people reached), and a press release was distributed to media outlets countywide. A Spanish interpreter was secured for the entire event, and an ASL interpreter had been coordinated for a requesting family (though not used, due to illness).

4-H Food Preservation Workshop Set

The county 4-H Food Preservation leadership is offering a Freezing Workshop on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 9</u>, <u>from 1-3:30 p.m. in the County Government Center</u>, <u>Elkhorn.</u> This hands-on workshop is open to all youth, grades 3-13. 4-Hers are welcome to sign-up their non-4-H friends. During the workshop, participants will prepare applesauce and butternut squash for freezing, and each participant will go home with a sample of each. Cost is \$5 per youth; checks should be made payable to the *Walworth County Senior Leaders' Association*. <u>Pre-register by November 1 at noon</u> by replying to this email or calling 262-741-4959. Share the following for each participant: 1) first and last name; 2) grade level; 3) email address; and 4) phone number for parent/guardian on November 9. This workshop is limited to first 12 youth who pre-register. Inform the Extension office immediately if you pre-register and your plans change so that youth on the waiting list to attend (if relevant) can be contacted.

4-H Promotional Display Available to Borrow

The Extension office has one 4-H promotional display available for clubs/groups to borrow and utilize at community events or displays in businesses throughout the year. If you have an event/instance that you would like to use it for, please contact the Extension office to get on the schedule. Be sure to let us know how many fliers you anticipate needing, along with when you plan to pick the display up and return it.

Responding to 4-H Inquiries

This is the season for lots of 4-H inquiries. To ensure that we are making our organization as welcoming and inclusive as possible, please make every effort to call/email new families reaching out to you back in a timely fashion (goal is within 48 hours). In nearly every case, your attention and responsiveness to their inquiry is their first real impression of how the 4-H club experience is going to go for them. It is especially important to get in touch with them in case they have accommodations requests (such as a language interpreter) which we will need as much time as possible to set up through campus (usually at least a week).

Notify Office of Changes in Meeting Locations/Times & Special Events

The Extension Office is basing its knowledge of your club and group meetings on what you submit in the club calendar portion of the charter each year. Any changes to dates, locations, or times need to be reported to us as soon as you are aware that they will occur in order for your club members to be covered by insurance. They are also important so that we know where and when to send prospective new families for your meetings. If you are a project group that does not submit a charter, but you are having meetings, please be sure that your meetings have been turned into the Extension Office before they happen.

Volunteer Enrollment

Adults who are planning to serve as 4-H volunteers this year are required to complete their annual enrollment on 4HOnline.com. Enrollment help is available from your general club leader if you are "affiliated" with a club. If you are not "affiliated," please call Sue at the 4-H office if you are having trouble enrolling: (262) 741-4954. Continuing leaders are encouraged to complete enrollment online no later than **December 1**.

In accordance with state policy, only volunteers who have completed the 4-H screening process and complete their annual enrollment online will be considered 2019-2020 volunteers. The screening process includes 4HOnline enrollment, mandatory reporter training (in 4honline), background check (every 4 years), and VIP training (in person) If you need to complete the training, please contact Janel Heidelmeier at (262) 741-4960 or janel.heidelmeier@wisc.edu.

Be aware you will not be approved at the county level if all of these steps are not completed.

If you require the county 4-H Office to enter your enrollment in 4HOnline for you, a complete set of enrollment paperwork is required per the state guidelines, to be filled out and filed in the county office. These papers will be available on request from Susan Clark via phone 262-741-4954 or email at sclark@co.walworth.wi.us.

Unfinished Business:

Fall Forum clarification about payment: Tim Boss made a motion, seconded by Rick Thomas, to keep things as they are, motion carried.

Back to 4-H Night was a huge success. It was a great asset having the table with club information fliers that could be handed out.

Explorer/Cloverbud Workshop Report was given by Laurie Giorno. There were 22 members present--mostly boys. All enjoyed a fun-filled afternoon of events. Maybe next year, do not have it last as long. Had to come up with activities at the last minute to fill all of the time.

Debbie handed out the Family Perspective Survey results, and discussed them with us. As a county, significant gains were made in a number of areas—especially in terms of making club meetings more engaging, valuable, welcoming, and fun.

New Business:

Exec Board Report: It was discussed that camp prices will stay the same as they were in 2017. Camp is returning to the old format of 4 days and 3 nights for 2020.

Junior Leaders' Association Meeting Minutes October 28, 2019

We then moved onto the UWEX report, which included the following:

- Debbie is organizing After-School Programs at Turtle Creek Elementary School in Delavan. She needs 4-H youth leaders to help, specifically youth leaders in the following projects:
 - Foods which was the next one on Oct 30.
 - Wildlife
 - Horticulture/Crops/Gardens
 - Aerospace
 - Horse and Pony (preferably with an equine attached)
 - Josiah Harder, Claire Schilz and Maddie Eggert were thanked for filling previous slots.
- Back to 4H Night was a huge success with 85 potential families coming through. Janel Heidelmeier thanked everyone for his or her help.
- The Foods Project will be hosting a preservation workshop on November 9 from 1-3:30 at the Government Center. There will a \$5 fee per person.
- Kids College will happen this year on Feb 1 from 9-4:00, but needs volunteers in order for it to happen.
 - Teachers are needed for classes related to 4H projects. If you are interested or know someone, Janel passed around planning sheets.

We then moved onto Committee Reports. The only ongoing committee, the House of Pork Committee has yet to meet this year, so we moved on. Next on the agenda was the Unfinished Business, which included the following:

- The Budget Committee had met before the meeting. Josiah read the new budget to see if anyone had any objections to it.
 - Janel reminded everyone that we still needed to budget funds for the annual Officers Retreat. Janel proposed that \$1200. Mason brought the proposal to the floor by proposing that we set aside \$1200.
 Kylie to motioned to approve that proposal and add it to the budget and Lucy seconded. Motion carried
 - Hailey Rieken motioned to approve the budget with the addition of \$1200, and Ty Adams seconded.
 Motion carried. The budget was approved.
- The Jr/Sr Leaders Banquet will be held at the Monte Carlo room on November 17. There are reservation sheets available on the table.
- Fall Forum is this upcoming weekend. Jr Leaders is paying ⅓ of the total cost, \$53.30 per delegate.
- Officers School was a success. Those that attended shared what they had learned.
- NE/SE District Reps
 - Janel reminded everyone of the requirements that eligible candidates must have attended 5
 meetings, and be in their second year of Jr Leaders <u>unless no candidates are found meeting those</u>
 requirements, then anyone from that district is eligible.
 - Kylie Kundert was the only one present from the SE District and self-nominated herself. She was voted in by the association.
 - Emma and Gina Henningfeld were the only ones from the NE District. Despite this being their first meeting, they asked if they could think on it. Gina later decided that she would represent her district.

We then continued onto New Business, which included the following:

- Kids College is coming up. Once again, help is needed for this to happen.
- The County 4-H Policy is being updated to better reflect new state policies. Notable changes are:
 - o New members will now have until May 1 to enroll in order to be Fair eligible.
 - New deadlines are to reflect who is eligible to show at fair.
 - o It will be emphasized in the document that in order to show animals, you need to check deadlines for that species department.
- Executive Board Highlights
 - It was noted that despite being the shortest executive board Amanda had ever been in, a lot of discussed.
 - o Biggest news from the Exec. Board was the new county policies and that 4-H Camp is going back to the four days instead of five. The fees will be similar to 2018.
- Space Camp Report
 - David Crudden shared his experiences attended the 2019 WI Space Camp and thanked the Junior Leaders for supporting him to go.

Maya then asked for the club/project reports.

- Sharon recently visited the Apple Barn.
- Maya shared her county wide Food Drive
