Track your 4-H Participation

If you don't have a calendar where you're marking down your 4-H activities on a regular basis, this is a great time to start one! Mandatory project meetings are getting into full swing on top of a host of club and county activities. Make a note of each thing you do in 4-H as you do it, and filling out your 4-H record forms—particularly the *Permanent* Participation Record (PPR)—will be a piece of cake in the early fall when record books are due! Attend a club meeting? Mark it down? Club had a guest presenter who talked about wildlife? Mark it down! Attended a mandatory swine project meeting? Mark it down! Playing a trombone solo at your next 4-H

meeting? Mark it down. Attended the last three Junior Leaders' Association meetings? Mark them down!

4-H Record Books are optional, but 4-Hers are strongly encouraged to complete a record book annually as a means of keeping track of accomplishments and participation. This will come in very handy when it comes to applying for college scholarships and writing college and job resumes during high school and beyond. Additionally, record books help make you eligible for special county awards (plaques, pins, and bragging rights) that have a long, rich history in Walworth County. Some 4-H Association-sponsored national trip scholarship applications also require content

pulled directly from 4-H Record Books.

Youth Leader Project Opportunities

If you are in 6th grade or older and looking to take your 4-H experience up a notch, consider enrolling as a 4-H Youth Leader. You can do this one of two ways: 1) Enroll in the Youth Leadership 4-H Project OR 2) Enroll as a Youth Leader in a 4-H Project of your choosing.

The Youth Leadership Project is designed for 4-Hers looking for some general leadership experiences helping out their local club leaders, assisting with club or county event planning, or providing general leadership topic workshops/trainings for fellow members (e.g. leading ice breakers, helping with pre and post meeting programs, etc.). 4-Hers who are passionate about a particular project area can sign up as Youth Project Leaders in those areas to provide projectbased learning opportunities at their club level, support county 4H Project Committees (e.g. the Rabbit Project, Goat Project, etc.), teach project workshops at the county level, or even help the Extension staff with outreach efforts that are project-based.

Either way, you can build your soft skills so you'll be as prepared as you possibly can be when you graduate from the 4-H program and head out into the real world. Plus, there's special awards for top youth leaders who complete and submit 4-H Record Books documenting their efforts.

Sign up for the Youth Leadership Project or to be a Youth Project Leader in your 4HOnline account by May 1 to be eligible for corresponding fair exhibit classes. For more information about specific youth leadership opportunities, contact the Extension office.

Tools for New Families

The first couple of years of 4-H can be very confusing. A couple of tools that can help new families get some clarification are the *Major Event* Guide, the Great Beyond Handout, and the 2019-2020 Year-at-a-Glance. The Major Event Guide lists popular events and provides a brief explanation of each. The Great Beyond Handout provides greater detail about some "not-to-bemissed" opportunities you'll want to keep on your radar. The Year-at-a-Glance provides a very basic seasonal overview of what 4-Hers should be doing in their project experience, along with a listing of important events/dates to be aware of. Swine

As in past years, 4-H and FFA Project Swine must have official Walworth County identification tags and DNA samples on file in order to be eligible for exhibition at the 2020 Walworth County Fair. No spring weigh-in will be held.

Walworth County 4-H and FFA Swine Project families must purchase tags and DNA envelopes for any and all animals they wish to make eligible for this year's fair. Cost will be <u>\$5</u> <u>per animal</u> payable to the Walworth County Meat Animal Sale Committee. Tags and envelopes may be purchased in the name of the family. During fair-weigh-in, individual pigs will be linked to specific family members. Families are responsible for tagging and collecting DNA validation samples for their own animals. An explanation of how to pull the DNA samples will be provided with the envelopes. Tags and envelopes will be available for purchase at the Walworth County Government Center during the following times <u>ONLY:</u>

> March 10, 6:30 – 8:00 p.m. April 2, 6:30-8:00 p.m.

These are the dates of YQCA training, but <u>the start time for tag sales is a</u> <u>half hour after YQCA training begins.</u> This later start time for tag and DNA envelope sales is deliberate. YQCA participants cannot skip classes to make tag/DNA envelope purchases, so an accompanying adult or nonparticipating youth will need to do this for them, OR they will have to make the purchase at the conclusion of the training.

First Year Swine Project Member?

Behhart Showpigs is giving two lucky first year Walworth County Swine *Project* members a barrow. The two individuals will be able to choose their animal from purebred and crossbred animals. The giveaway application period opened on February 1 and will end on February 28. To apply, each applicant must send a 250 word essay explaining why they want to be a part of the swine project, what they hope to get out of the project, and what they will do to give back to their swine project community. The essay must be accompanied by a cover letter including the applicant's age, address, phone number, year in 4-H, and one fact about swine the applicant finds most interesting. YQCA Training '20

4-Hers who are in the Beef, Sheep, and Swine Projects must be YQCAcertified in order to show at this year's fair. To achieve certification, youth must visit https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/L ogin to create or log into their account and either sign-up for a face-to-face training or complete the on-line training for their age level (as of January 1). This must be done annually. Cost is \$3 for the face-toface training or \$12 for the on-line training, both of which must be paid on-line. The on-line training is estimated to require about 60 minutes. For youth, ages 12, 15, and 19 only, there is also an option to test instead of completing the training. Anyone not passing the test with 80% or better will automatically be redirected to the trainings. The cost to test is the same as the cost to take the on-line training, however it costs more up front, since you test out of multiple years so you must pay for all of them at once.

Walworth County is offering two face-to-face trainings for youth, ages

8-18: March 10 and April 2 from 6:00-8:00 p.m. in the County Government Center. <u>Youth must pre-register and</u> pay to participate through their <u>YQCA account by March 6 for the first</u> <u>training and March 30 for the</u> <u>second.</u>

4-Hers should plan to have their training complete by mid-April so they are ready to register for the county fair with their certification number in hand. Premise ID's Required for Most Animals

The Wisconsin Livestock Premises Registration Act requires anyone who keeps, houses, or co-mingles livestock to register their premises. Premises Registration Act rules include: bovine (bison, cattle); equine (horses, donkeys, mules); goats; poultry (chickens, turkeys, geese, duck, guinea fowl, and squab); captive game birds (pheasants, quail, wild turkeys, migratory wildfowl, pigeons, and exotic birds); sheep; swine (other than wild hogs, but including potbelly pigs); farm-raised deer (elk, moose, caribou, reindeer, and the subfamily musk deer), camelids (llamas, alpacas); ratites (rheas, ostriches, emus, cassowary, kiwi); and fish (aquaculture farm). Rabbits, cats, and dogs are NOT included. To register, go to: https://wiid.org/premises registrati on/.
