<u>4-H Camp Update</u>

4-H Camp '20, originally set for June 14-17 at Upham Woods in the Wisconsin Dells, was cancelled due to state and UW-Madison restrictions imposed by COVID-19. Paid camper registration fees are in the process of being reimbursed.

The 4-H Camp Counselor Team is continuing to train and plan for an alternative 4-H Camp experience to be held at the Walworth County Fairgrounds, July 23-24 so long as state and university meeting restrictions have been lifted enough to allow for it to happen. The event will be structured like two full days at resident camp--beginning with cabin group icebreakers on Day #1 and ending with closing campfire on Day #2. However, the event will be handled like a "day camp" with no overnight options. This will be a great way for long-time campers to enjoy familiar activities and for members who have never attended 4-H Camp to try it out! Promotional materials and more info will be forthcoming. 4-H Camp 2021 is set for June 13-16 at Upham Woods.

April 2nd YQCA Face-to-Face Meeting Rescheduled

The YQCA Face-to-Face Training originally set for April 2 has been rescheduled for **July 7** pending the removal of meeting restrictions prohibiting it from happening. Only those youths who previously registered may attend. They may be accompanied to the meeting location by no more than ONE other person (including their driver, if that person is someone other than themselves). Participants may attend a 9-10 a.m. session OR 4-5 p.m. session. Eligible youth are being contacted to make arrangements. No new registrations are being accepted. Anyone else needing YQCA certification must complete the on-line training.

Market Lamb Tag & DNA Envelope Order Deadline—April 29

Due to meeting restrictions imposed by COVID-19, all 4-Hers who wish to show market lambs in the 2020 Walworth County Junior Sheep Show must order their RFID tags and DNA envelopes by mail.
