Committee Reports:

4-H Awards Committee: There were more books than expected, all have been judged and award winners chosen.

HOP: Laurie has been trying to work with the insurance company to see if we could possibly get a refund on part of the premium, since the trailer not used and possibly cancel the liability insurance on it. Tim Boss made a motion, seconded by Janice Schilz, to cancel the liability insurance for now and get it added back to the policy when needed. Motion carried. Laurie is also trying to get in touch with the Pepsi Company to see if maybe we would not have to pay rent on the fountain and pay to repair the refrigerator.

Unfinished Business:

Ray Schilz read a reply letter that the state sent in response to the letter we had sent them. If you would like a copy let Debbie know.

New Business:

Debbie asked the group to set goals for the 2020-2021 charter. They are needed for chartering. The group agreed on these goals:

- 1) Our group will conduct two educational programs specifically focused on creating a more welcoming/inclusive environment for new members
- 2) Members will partner with Extension to host an interactive open house to welcome potential new families into the community club program. A Spanish interpreter will be provided throughout the event. ASL interpreter provided upon request. Promo flier will be in English and Spanish with "NEXT STEPS" handout being translated into Spanish for2021.

4-H Camp registration fees for 2021 were discussed. Tim Boss made a motion, seconded by Rick Thomas, to keep the prices the same as last year with the Sr. Leaders to absorb the \$44.50 difference per camper. Motion carried.

After discussing different ways to present the awards and recognize the members that earned them a committee was established to try and figure out a way to honor this year's recipients. Committee members include: Linda Giorno, Sarah Boss, Bill Marquart, Ray Schilz, and Renee Rieck.

The group split into breakout rooms to discuss ways to keep communicating with their members. Some ideas were holding zoom meetings and reminding members to keep participating in the county 4-H Family Challenge. It was agreed by all, zoom meetings do not work as well as face-to-face meetings. Members should keep connecting with the project leaders. Everyone's commitment is really being tested with all of the new challenges. Make sure the 4-H News Blog is being used. Two ideas suggested for Extension to strengthen communication included providing families with a quick reference guide of who to call or where to go for help AND hiding a word or symbol in the text of the 4-H News Blog with those spotting it earning some type of little award or recognition.

Key Leader Approvals:

Linda Giorno made a motion, seconded by Laurie Giorno, to approve Bill Marquart as Poultry Key Leader; Chris Jones as Youth Leadership Key Leader; Sally Morgan and Laurie Giorno as Foods & Nutrition Co-Key Leaders; Kathy Tober as Natural Science Key Leader; and Marlene Schoenbeck as Flowers/Houseplant and Food Preservation Key Leader. Motion carried.

Club/Group Reports:

The Elkhorn club is welcoming three new leaders that have taken on the role of General Leaders.

Donna Sherman said Sorg's Meat Market had a silo topple over and do damage to the building they have always supported the 4-H program. It was suggested that Extension might send them a card on behalf of the group.

Election of Officers: Ray Schilz made a motion, seconded by Rick Thomas, to elect Tim Boss as President. Motion carried.

Treasurer Kristi Plenty agreed to keep the position until a new treasurer is found. Tim Boss shared that he might have a lead on someone who might be interested. No one present during the meeting was interested in taking on the role.

We are in need of someone to fill the Sunshine Position. Information will be sent out explaining the position to hopefully find someone interested.

Because no one present at the meeting was interested in filling any of the open District Rep positions, Debbie Harris contacted the current District Reps to see if they were still interested in holding the position for another term. SE District Ashley VanSchyndel said yes; Central District Caroline Cornelison said yes; still waiting to hear back from SW District Rep, Jennifer Schell A motion was made by Linda Giorno, seconded by Tim Boss, to approve the District Representatives that have said yes--and Jennifer if she agrees. Motion carried.
