- 2) Complete the corresponding participation reports for these programs: 4-H Road Trip Challenge, 4-H Geocaching Challenge, 4-H Service Project Challenge, 4-H Monthly Interactive Meeting Challenge, and 4-H Holiday Greeting Challenge. Links to all reports are in the 4-H News Blog.

They have to do both of these steps to earn entries into the 4-H Family Challenge Prize Drawings. Second drawing is March 15th. Last day to complete Participation Reports for entry is March 4. Congrats to these first drawing winners: Thomas Family (1st Place), Giorno Family (2nd Place), and Leedle Family (3rd Place).

While our 4-H staff remains hopeful that COVID-19 meeting restrictions will be gradually decreasing in the months ahead, we are planning for programming that will meet current guidance through August. In the event that restrictions are lifted, we can easily shift back into a combination of virtual and face-to-face opportunities. To keep things fresh, we will be offering new and different challenges beginning in March. Families may continue to participate in and report on past challenges, but no new data opportunities will be added to them. Plans are still in the works, but here is what is known thus far...

- A **Science Sleuths Challenge** will be offered monthly.
- A **4-H Video Challenge** will be offered over multiple months' time. Though not limited to older members, this challenge will target families with 4-Hers in grades 7-13.
- A unique challenge targeting families with 4-Hers in grades 5K-6 will be offered monthly.
- The county-wide Monthly Interactive Meetings will shift to monthly **project-based meetings.** Some will have required advanced sign-ups and others will be open for anyone.
- With Association support, two prize drawings will be held with all families who complete "participation reports" for their challenge activities earning entries. Expected drawing dates will be: June 15 and September 15.

Our last county-wide Monthly Interactive Meeting is set for Feb. 16 at 6:30 p.m. via Zoom. It will be a BINGO Game Night.

4-H ONLINE Member Approvals

All youth and leader membership has been approved and will continue to be approved as they enroll. Once enrollment closes and BEFORE MAY 15, you will receive a list of all of the members who enrolled in your club. You will have until May 24 to identify any members on your list who were not active and did not pay dues. Then, shortly after, you will be billed for that reconciled membership listing. If you do NOT respond with your reconciled total by May 24, you will be billed for/responsible for paying for the entire list.

4-H ONLINE 2.0 Leader Access

Leader access has been snail mailed to the Primary General Leader. If other General Leaders would like access an email from the Primary General Leader needs to be sent to Susan Clark at sclark@co.walworth.wi.us. The access pin that was sent in the letter is for your club, so all leaders with access will use the same pin. Whom you choose to share this with will be up to you. The access code was generated by 4-H Online and is your permanent code; it is case sensitive. At this time, when you log in as a leader, you will only be able to see the members and leaders that have signed up and are approved, along with their contact information. 4-H ONLINE Project List Access

Our Walworth County YQCA guidelines are not yet set for 2021. They will be coming soon, appearing in the 4-H News Blog, on the 4-H website, and being directly emailed to youth in the Beef, Sheep, and Swine projects.

New Business: Several clubs shared what they have been doing with their clubs to stay engaged with their members.

In person guidelines were gone over; they are changing some, but clubs/groups still need to get approvals for gatherings. Remember if you are filling out forms for getting together approval it does take at least 3-5 days so plan ahead.

Updates to the current Family Challenge options will be ending in February. Debbie and Janel are working on another 6 months of activities in case the in-person gatherings still won't be happening. Remind members if they are doing things to please fill in the participation report forms so the county knows who and how many members are participating in activities. This round of activities will be directed more towards projects.

Debbie said they spent \$240.00 toward each round of awards for the challenges (September-February). Jennifer Schell made a motion, seconded by Bill Marquart, to give \$250.00 for the next round of challenge prizes (March-May; drawing June 15), motion carried.

Bill Marquart suggested the leaders do something special for Letha, thanking her for being the Sunshine person for so long. Bill Marquart made a motion, seconded by Jennifer Schell, to spend \$25.00 on a thank you gift. Motion carried.
