Sign-up to Help at Pre-fair Judging

A number of youth and adult helpers are needed to help ensure a smooth, stress-free Youth Building judging experience on August 18-19. Please consider volunteering your time to help out.

The two roles available are "Recorder" and "Runner." Recorders are adults, ages 21+, who assist department leadership in documenting which rating ribbons exhibitors have received and place rating stickers on the entry tags of judged items. Runners typically transport judged items from the recorder to specified locations within the judging area for later consideration, serve as gophers for the department lead, and are sometimes asked to call exhibitors up for judging using the DMV-style numbering system. "Into the Lab" Campus Trip Wrap-up

Twenty Walworth County youth, grades 5-9, traveled to UW-Madison on June 16th to meet with scientists from a variety of fields, explore three campus "labs" in depth, and engage in hands-on science activities as part of the *4-H Science Explorers: Into the Lab Campus Trip.* Five scientists shared 10-minute presentations about their areas of expertise during a "scientist reception," and DC Smith Greenhouse, the Biotechnology Center Stem Cell Learning Lab, and Dairy Cattle Center were featured during the deep dive to provide a blend of learning experiences that appealed to all types of learners. Highlights of the day included group games, building terrariums, simulating stem cell lab experiments, and engaging in a close encounter with the ruminant stomach of a dairy cow. WI 4-H Charters

It is time to start working on your 4-H Club/Group chartering paperwork for the upcoming 4-H year. It is important to remember that your 4-H charter indicates the club or group is organized in accordance with objectives of the 4-H program. It authorizes the club or group to use the 4-H emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The purpose of the 4-H Charter is education, communication and accountability.

Like usual, the process will consist of two parts again this year. The paperwork for part one along with instructions for part two were sent in the mail a couple of weeks ago. If you have not received your packet of information please reach out. Incident reports

A quick reminder about accident and injury reporting. UW-Madison Risk Management requires that all high-risk NON-UW-Madison employee injuries/incidents be reported. This includes, but not limited to:

- A bodily injury occurs to an Extension Volunteer, Extension Program Participant, or a third party as a result of Extension Programs, Events or Activities
- Property damage is incurred by a third party as a result of Extension Programs, Events, or Activities
- An injury/incident occurs that could be classified as "high risk" as a result of Extension Program, Events or Activities

All incident reports must be filed ASAP but no later than within 48 hours of an accident or injury. Reports should be turned in to Janel Heidelmeier to be uploaded within the 48 hours following the accident or injury.
