## **Club or Project Reports:**

It was confirmed that there will be a Quilt Auction this year during the Walworth County Fair and so tickets will be sold in the youth building during club assignments.

Fair assignments in the HOP and Youth Building are to be considered. Discussion was brought forward as to how to handle these assignments as many clubs do not have youth old enough to man HOP. Suggestions included assigning a percentage of volunteers from each club as during Farm Tech Days. This way no one club is required to provide all the volunteers for the whole day. Considerations of asking Alumni to help might be warranted. Another suggestion was Status quo: picking the same days as the previous year so your club always know the day and times you are assigned. After discussing it was motioned by Billie Jean and Chelsea Police, to continue with "Status quo" for this year. Please forward your top 5 time/day requests to Janel.

Membership fees were distributed to clubs. Please check your list and send email to Janel for needed updates prior to June 1. UW Extension sends enrollment into home office based on these lists. Be aware that the Fair uses the lists provided by the 4H Extension. Any youth from organizations like Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Home School, etc. may enter non-animal projects and these individuals may be included within your charged membership. Policing these individuals is the responsibility of the 4H leaders, so if they are not your members, do not pay for them and have them removed from your list.

Sugar Creek shared a community service project of putting together Birthday Kit decorating bags which include cake mixes, sprinkles, party favors etc. for food pantry patrons so the needy individuals can have a special treat to celebrate their birthday.
