## **Enrollment Reminder**

Enrollment for the 2024-2025 4-H program year is now open! Members and volunteers must be enrolled for the new program year prior to attending meetings or participate in activities. Complete your enrollment ASAP, but **no later than December 1** to continue receiving correspondence from the Extension office; after December 1, the distribution list will be updated. When logging into 4honline.com, be sure to use the same profile information (email and password) that you used in the past. If you have forgotten your password, simply use the "reset password" feature to create a new one.

Please be aware that 4-H members may enroll up until May 1 to be eligible to show in Junior Division competitions at the 2025 Walworth County Fair. That said, the sooner they sign up, the sooner they will receive 4-H communications. Our office does submit a list to the Walworth County Fair to verify enrollment. As we approach that deadline please remind families that they must be enrolled.

Club and project leaders, please enroll by October 1! Don't forget to set aside some time to complete any training that you may need to complete.

### **4-H Membership Dues**

**NOW ONLINE!** Payment for 4-H membership will now be collected on 4honline at the time of enrollment. Families will have the option to pay by credit/debit card or cash/check. If families choose to pay by cash/check their enrollments will not be approved until payment is received. They will have 10 business days to pay. If after 10 days payments have not been received their enrollments will be sent back and they will have to resubmit.

## **Updated Code of Conduct**

The 4-H youth Code of Conduct has been updated. A copy is being provided as a simple reminder of the standard all participants are expected to follow. The Code of Conduct is signed annually by new and returning members. Expectations apply to all 4-H activities (i.e. in-person, social media, virtual meetings, etc.).
